What is Social Impact?

Making people happy

It's the change that we created in the lives of our actors, participants, their families, staff and the sector.

We wanted to discover how we at Hijinx has contributed to our communities. We wanted to know our economic impact as well as the personal stories from the people we work with.

We commissioned an independent evaluation of how we have changed the lives of our actors, participants and their families, our staff, our partners and the arts sector.

Over the course of a year our researchers unearthed some key themes that makes Hijinx so important as the national inclusive theatre company of Wales. We will share those key stories of how we benefit those with learning disabled and/or autistic (LD/A) and those around them and how we are helping to change opinions of the sector and our communities.

Researchers:

We reach thousands of people each year. In over a year we engaged with

- 123 LD/A actors.
- Supported 228 parents or carers.
- 1336 people have been on Hijinx training to learn how to communicate effectively.

We created over £4.5 million of social value. For every **£1** invested in Hijinx we generated £4.84 of social value.

What does this mean financially? This means we generated...

weekly shops

We show that the performing arts are a vehicle for health and wellbeing, and increase happiness in people's lives.

"One day a week she is really happy and has something to look forward to. Up until she joined she hadn't had anything like this. It's the one night she goes out and socialises. It's made a huge difference." Parent





- 73% of actors and participants said they felt happier since joining Hijinx.
- We helped our community of actors and participants feel less isolated during COVID-19. Some of the research that took part during the first lockdown showed how our virtual activities helped to provide a focus each week for our actors and participants, creating a continuity of connection with each other and us.

Confidence to perform on stage and everyday life

We invest in our actors' and participants' acting skills. They gain increased professionalism and we have seen communication skills improve. We have seen them more confident in sharing their opinions and experiences, where they may have struggled to do so before.

"They gain very comprehensive skills. Acting, script work, movement, dance, mime, clowning, puppetry and recently they have learnt to self-tape, to help them put themselves forward for roles. It is a whole curriculum, and the quality of the tutors is at a really high level."

"I went from a meek shy girl who wouldn't do anything to an independent confident girl who is confident to go travelling and they [my parents] don't have to worry about me. Thanks to adult placement and Hijinx I'm here doing what I do today. They are awesome. They've helped me a lot." **Hijinx Actor**

- 9 out of 10 Hijinx actors are more confident as a result of their work with Hijinx.
- 72% of our actors experienced an increase in their independence as a result of joining Hijinx.

Our actors are now more organised and some travelling on their own, supported by Hijinx to travel to many foreign countries. Some of our individuals have become increasingly independent and have taken on more responsibility during their time with us, including independent living.



People around us



As well as contributing to help our actors and participants improve skills and confidence, we also improved the lifestyle for families, friends and our staff.

In a short space of time the actor can go off on their own away from home and travel and tour with us.

"It is a bit of a life changer working with Hijinx. It's changed my views on people with learning disabilities dramatically. I thought I was openminded but there are certain things that society implants in you. I realised some of the attitudes I had picked up weren't the reality." Staff



Changing Perceptions

Changing the sector

We are contributing to changing the perception of how learning disabled and/ or autistic (LD/A) people are seen on stage, screen and in our communities.

"One mum came up to me in tears. She said, 'It's changed how I see people with learning disabilities, and I am a mum of a person with learning disabilities. It's really changed the possibilities for us for the future." **Hijinx Staff**



Our community of artists deal with negative perceptions daily. They are often treated like children, they are patronised, decisions are made for them, people talk for them, help, though often well-meaning is often not needed or wanted, and at worse they receive abuse.

Parents felt that there are limited opportunities for learning disabled and/or autistic (LD/A) people and that Hijinx is a positive and forwardthinking organisation which provides a very good experience.

Staff members reported parents having changed expectations of their child who are learning disabled and/or autistic (LD/A) people as a result of their actor's or participant's work with Hijinx.

• 73% of Hijinx parents say it has changed their expectations of what their children are capable of.

Covid Recovery

We will work to ensure that our communities are not excluded from engaging with the arts after the pandemic.

We alongside many other organisations and individuals will continue to lobby for inclusive provision for artists, participants and audiences.

We will lobby the screen and stage industries to follow the Seven Industry Principles, a new guide to support the industry to make decisions inclusively, to go beyond compliance and celebrate diversity.

We will support our actors and participants to return to in-the-room activity in a safe and considered way. Striving to re-build their confidence and nurture their talent.

Ambitions

We will not limit or reduce our ambitions for the future - if anything we are emboldened!

We will continue to challenge perceptions, striving for equity and representation of learning disabled and autistic people on screen, stage, and our communities by working with partners to change thinking and ways of working and remove systemic barriers.

We will get our inclusive productions back on the road and use our learning from lockdown to develop new hybrid digital theatre productions that are accessible and inclusive for all.


