BIOS AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION

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Hijinx is an award-winning, inclusive theatre company based in Cardiff, creating bold, high-quality productions. We believe in breaking down barriers in the arts, and all our productions feature learning disabled and autistic performers alongside neurotypical performers. To support this work, we run a network of Academies across Wales, offering professional performance training to neurodivergent actors—many of whom face significant barriers to accessing traditional drama schools. In 2024, we established The Ensemble, a selection of Academy members that research and develop future production concepts and potentially go on to bring these ideas to life, ensuring that every show is built on genuine talent, collaboration, and equality.

Since its premiere in 2016, Meet Fred has toured extensively across the UK and internationally, performing in over 20 countries across Europe, Asia, and North America. The show has captivated audiences worldwide with its sharp humour and powerful message about control, independence, and what it means to be human. Meet Fred features three exceptional learning disabled performers, all of whom played a key role in devising the production. As we celebrate its 10th anniversary tour, we remain as committed as ever to challenging perceptions and championing truly inclusive theatre on a global scale.

BLIND SUMMIT

Based in London, Blind Summit is recognised as one of the UK's most exciting companies working with puppetry. They have had huge success with productions such as *The Table* and *Citizen Puppet*, and often work with companies such as Complicite and ENO. Hijinx came into contact with Blind Summit in April 2014 when we invited them to run a week's training in puppetry for our Academy students in Cardiff. We were joined by three of their artists, including Artistic Director Mark Down, it was during this week that the seed for making an inclusive production with a puppet was sown. Blind Summit have supported us throughout the process, from their designers making a set of puppets for us to train and explore with, and providing associate artists Tom Espiner and Giulia Innocenti to work with us during the research and development stage for the project and rehearsals.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: CREATING 'MEET FRED'

As we explored the idea of creating an inclusive show with a puppet, the parallels between life for a puppet and the experiences of the learning disabled artists we work with quickly became clear. Just as many of the people we collaborate with rely on support to live independently, Fred depends entirely on his three puppeteers simply to exist. This relationship of dependence and interdependence mirrors the reality faced by many learning disabled and disabled people in everyday life.

In any devised process, the people in the room shape the direction a piece takes, influenced by their lived experiences at that moment. As we were making this show, our learning disabled performers were navigating the upheaval caused by sweeping changes to the benefits system. We asked ourselves: what would life be like for Fred in this environment? What if he were threatened with losing his Puppetry Living Allowance? Without his puppeteers, could he survive at all?

Suddenly, what began as a whimsical puppet show took on a serious political edge. Yet, rather than losing its humour, the absurdity of the situation only heightened when seen through the eyes of our puppet hero. The result is a show that is both hilarious and sharply satirical, holding a mirror to the real-world struggles of those who rely on support to live with dignity.

BOX OFFICE INFORMATION

Age Guidance: Recommended 14+ contains strong language, adult themes and puppet nudity.

Running time: 80 minutes with no interval.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

General: Meet Fred travels with 7 performers, 1 technician and 1 creative enabler.

Sometimes we need to bring 2 creative enablers, if members of the cast require

extra support.

Get-In Time Needed: 3 hours **Get-Out Time Needed:** 1 hour

Touring Set: Five 6×8ft flats and two flight cases (both fitted with batteries and supply 12v

power for birdies), two chairs, a wooden ladder and various props. Picture

below.

Venue requirements: Most suited to studio spaces, with tiered seating, of capacity 80-200.

Minimum playing space: 6m wide / 4.5m deep / 3m high.

A "Black Box" style space is ideal, with a black stage surface preferred. The stage should be surrounded by black or similarly dark-coloured walls or drapes, and

there should be at least one entrance/exit to the backstage area.

We need x1 seat reserved in the auditorium for 'The Director' character to be

positioned pre-show.

Sound: All sound playback is cued from a laptop /iPad at the lighting op position. There

is no live sound in the production and no fallback is required on stage.

LX: Please see LX plan below. We will bring our own LX desk and all fixtures on the

floor/booms. Where possible, we prefer the venue to pre-rig the FOH and side

bars.



Misc.: A smoke machine (that we provide) will be used twice during the performance.

COSTS AND TOURING INFORMATION

Currently taking bookings for: January - March 2026

However, please still enquire if you are interested other dates.

Performance Fee: 1 day booking £2,000 = Get in + 1 (evening) performance.

2 day booking £3,800 = Max 3 shows. Two evenings and/or matinees.
3 day booking £5,400 = Max 5 shows. Popular for festivals or weekend runs.
4 day booking £6,000 = Max 6 shows. Best for community/school matinees.
5 day booking £6,250 = Max 7 shows. Full week offer, maximum value.

NOTE: The above rates are subsidised, and therefore dependant on a successful funding application to ACW & ACE. The rates include all associated travel, accommodation, per diems and access costs for the touring company, plus a

contribution to venue marketing (inc delivered print if required).

Hijinx will invoice in GBP and are not VAT registered.

Touring Party: 9 adults (7 Performers, 1 Technician, 1 Creative Enabler).

Sometimes we need 2 Creative Enablers, and will confirm this asap after any

booking.

Dressing Rooms: Two private and secure dressing rooms are required, each comfortably

accommodating up to six people.
